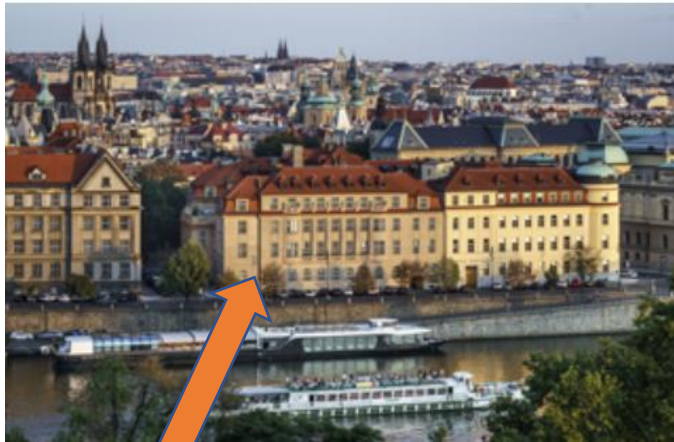




Prague travel information

Arrival by plane

If you arrive by plane at the Václav Havel airport, you can take the bus no. 119 to Nádraží Veveřská, where you can change to metro A line (green line) towards Depo Hostivař. The venue is located at the Staroměstská metro station. Public transport tickets must be purchased in advance before the passenger boards

the bus. Tickets are sold in the Visitor Centre, at the Prague Public Transit company counters in Arrival Halls, or from ticket vending machines located throughout both terminals and directly at bus stops. Most ticket machines accept contactless credit card payments. Another option is to take the Airport Express, which connects the airport with the Prague Main Railway Station. It does not stop anywhere else and public transport tickets are not valid on this special bus line. When travelling from the airport, the Airport Express bus tickets may be purchased in the Visitor Centre at Arrival Hall or directly from the driver. You can also take a taxi, which can be booked online through the Prague Airport website: <https://www.prg.aero/en/order-taxi-service-online>.



Arrival by train

There are good train connections between Prague and other European cities. If you arrive by train, you will travel to the city center from Prague Main Railway Station. The venue is within (longer) walking distance from the station. If you prefer, you can take metro C line (red line) in the direction Háje and change at Muzeum station to line A (green line) towards Nemocnice Motol. The venue is located at the metro station Staroměstská on line A. There are also several tram lines nearby the Main Railway Station but the connection to the venue is not direct.

Venue

The course will be held at the Faculty of Nuclear Sciences and Physical Engineering of the Czech Technical University in Prague: <https://www.fjfi.cvut.cz/en/> Until recently, it had long been the only university in the Czech Republic providing medical physics education.

The Faculty has two buildings, the course will take place in the building that is situated in Břehová street, no. 7, in the Prague Old Town. The venue is located in a beautiful environment at the bank of the river Vltava and right in the historical city centre with views of the Prague castle. The lunch and the social dinner will take place nearby the venue.

Tickets

Tickets for public transport can be purchased in the following ways:

- In information centers and selling points at most of the metro stations
- In yellow ticket vending machines at metro stations and some surface transit stops
- In newspaper shops in the whole area of Prague
- Inside every tram (only by contactless credit/debit card)

Tickets must be validated – stamped in yellow boxes – when you get on the tram or bus or when entering the metro area. The exception is the contactless payment in the trams. There are four ticket fares, all of them are valid in all means of public transport:

- 30 CZK – valid for 30 minutes
- 40 CZK – valid for 90 minutes
- 120 CZK – valid for 24 hours
- 330 CZK – valid for 72 hours
